Submission of Manuscript.

Manuscripts are subject to editorial review. The manuscript submitted for publication in IJVR is not under simultaneous consideration by any other journal. Accepted papers will become the property of IAAVR and may only be reproduced in the benefit of profession with permission of the Editor, IJVR. **The soft copy of article can be sent by E-mail: rishendra_verma@yahoo.com**

Arrangement of manuscript

First Page: Title, (title should commensurate text) the author's name

and the institution where the work was conducted. Avoid superscripts showing designation of authors.

Summary: A brief summary of the work should be given

Key words: Selected key words 5-6 in alphabetical order be given

Introduction: An introduction paragraph giving latest know-how on the basis of published updated reports including aims and objects of the paper should be included

Materials and Methods: This section should describe the source of material and equipment's used and methods in experiment. The original or modified method of work should indicate changes made in the method in an explicit manner. Avoid using the statement " with minor modifications". If a reference is followed for a technique or method, do not describe full details of method. When reporting experiments on animals including laboratory animals, full description of breed, sex, age and husbandry should be given. The IAEC/CPCSEA clearance reference be mentioned.

Results: Data essential for understanding of the discussion and main conclusion emerging from the work should be described. Reproduction of data in text or presentation of same data in graphs or tables should be avoided. Interpretation of the results should go to the discussion part. Statistical analysis should be included wherever necessary.

Discussion: Long and ambiguous discussion should be scrupulously avoided. The discussion should deal with the interpretation of results under the context of latest knowledge on the subject and contemporary published literature. Vague words and inconclusive statements should be avoided.

Foot note: Avoid footnotes. When essential, they should be numbered consecutively and types at the foot of the appropriate page.

Tables and Illustrations: (numbered in Arabic numerals) should be prepared on illustration separate sheets.

References: The list of references should include only those publications which are cited in the text. References should be first arranged alphabetically, numbered consecutively and the number should be given in [] bracket in the text without sub or superscript.
